Rocky Peak straddles the L.A./ Ventura County line north of the 118 Freeway. While vegetation is sparse, the sandstone rock outcroppings are scenic and have been used as movie locations. On a clear day, the view is impressive.

THE HIKE: Hopefully, we will meet at the Chumash Trailhead and John Chady will take us in his "bus" to the other Rocky Peak Trailhead at the top of Santa Susana Pass. We will leave another car or two there for dropouts or emergencies. The fire road to the peak ascends steeply to the peak. From the peak, the fire road travels along the saddle back into the hills where it intersects with the top end of the Chumash Foot Trail. The hike is nearly all down hill from the peak down to our cars at the Chumash Trailhead.

DIRECTIONS TO CHUMASH TRAILHEAD: The Trailhead is at the east end of the Simi Valley, north of the Simi Valley Freeway (118). Take the Yosemite Offramp and go north about one-half mile, just past the three-way stop, turn onto Flanigan Drive, then proceed up the hill and follow the road round to the left. The Trailhead is at the very end of Flanigan Drive and the Trail is straight ahead.
